## 1. Overview

The *Accra Street Feast* was an outreach initiative under LifeLine's Volunteer Program aimed at combating hunger and spreading kindness among street-connected children and low-income individuals in Accra. Volunteer Group C took full ownership of the project—from cooking to distribution—serving over 100 hot, nutritious meals across two major areas: Makola and Madina.

This project embodied LifeLine's mission of direct community impact and youth empowerment, turning compassion into concrete action.

## 2. Objectives

The initiative was guided by four core goals:

- Provide immediate hunger relief through freshly cooked, balanced meals.
- Build empathy and human connection by engaging face-to-face with beneficiaries.
- Offer a practical, leadership-focused experience for volunteers in planning, teamwork, and execution.
- Raise awareness about food insecurity among Accra's street-connected children.

### 3. Key Activities

The project unfolded in three major stages:

a. Cookout & Preparation

Volunteers collaborated to prepare the meals from scratch—handling ingredient purchase, cooking, and hygiene supervision.

b. Packaging & Logistics

Meals were neatly portioned and paired with bottled water. Every package was sealed and labeled for safe and organized distribution.

c. Street Distribution

The team divided into groups and moved through Makola and Madina, personally delivering meals to children and families, sharing smiles, encouragement, and genuine human connection.

The *Accra Street Feast* achieved significant tangible and emotional results:

- 100+ individuals fed with fresh, nutritious meals and water.
- 2 major urban areas reached (Makola and Madina).
- 100% volunteer-led project—from planning to fieldwork.
- Strengthened LifeLine’s bond with local communities and enhanced visibility for future outreach programs.

Beyond numbers, the project fostered empathy, teamwork, and awareness among the volunteers, helping them see the power of collective service.
